### Medal Test Assessments

The purpose and aim of Medal Test Assessments is to help teachers provide structured and progressive learning for pupils; to encourage young people to maintain and develop their interest in Scottish Dance; and to improve their standard of dancing.

The Introductory Award is suitable for young children in their first year of dancing. Although there are no formal lower and upper age limits for candidates taking these tests, Grades 1 - 5 are aimed at dancers aged 7 to 16. # Primary School Accreditation Programme

This is for primary schools to learn Scottish Country Dances at BRONZE, SILVER and GOLD levels. The scheme can be used in conjunction with *'Jigs & Reels'*; a book of dances which includes 2 CDs and a DVD, and links in directly with the Curriculum for Excellence. ### Dancing Achievement Award (DAA)

These awards, at Intermediate, Advanced and Very Advanced levels, are intended for dancers who wish to improve their standard of dancing and to have that achievement recognised. The dancers must attend a training session/s of a minimum of 5 hours. Dancers must learn the set dances and other formations not included in those dances. This can be done at Summer School or locally by a Branch. ### Our Weekend in Blairgowrie

Every year for the past 22 years Ribble Valley RSCDS has run an annual weekend dance trip to Scotland. We try to go to explore a different location every year. We have managed this, other than by request, going to Inverness, Oban and Stirling twice!

The highlight of our weekend is always when we can get a local group to host a dance for us. It is good to show the newer dancers and people who don't normally travel, that by learning to dance, you can dance and make friends anywhere and basically we are all doing the same dances!

Our trips are very popular and usually fill up within a couple of weeks. This year was no exception and 50 of us arrived in Blairgowrie at the beginning of April to stay at the Angus Hotel. The Saturday night dance was hosted by Ericht SCD Club and the programme was quite challenging! We had been practising the dances, but we were still glad of the extra practice the night before in the hotel! On the Saturday night the town hall was buzzing! From my point of view, it was really good to meet up with old friends again from the Perthshire area. I think that all the dancers mixed splendidly together and the music from Jim Lindsay was superb! A very big THANK YOU to all who made this night so successful! It will be remembered as one of our best trips!

I'd also like to thank the local dancers who supported our ceilidh on the Sunday night in the hotel ballroom where Nicol McLaren played for us and even joined in with his own "turn"! A wonderful finish to a terrific weekend!

### Interview with Frank Thomson

### When did you start playing for Scottish country dancing?

I started playing the accordion at the age of 12, being taught by Bill Wilkie in Perth, back in the fifties when I lived at Glenalmond. As soon as I mastered a few Scottish tunes I was asked to play for Perth RSCDS classes in the Salutation Hotel. This is where and how I served my 'apprenticeship'! I would have been around 15/16 years of age then, and the teachers I remember are Miss McFeat (known as Kate) and a Miss Scrimgeour. Perhaps a few of the more senior dancers in Perth will remember those ladies. I also remember introducing 'The Glenalmond Gamekeeper' Donald Campbell from Buchanty to the classes and he took dancing up with much enthusiasm.

### Do you play other instruments other than the accordion?

The accordion is the only instrument I play, although I don't regard the accordion as a proper 'musical' instrument, when compared to instruments such as strings, woodwind, brass and piano. I still regard the accordion as a 'toy', but a very popular world-wide one and I'm happy that my parents decided that I should play one!

### What kind of music to you listen to?

I listen to a wide variety of music, and prefer to hear soloists back by small groups, rather than orchestras or large bands. My favourite recordings tend to be solo violin/fiddle accompanied by sympathetic piano playing by keyboard players such as Maureen Rutherford, Dennis Morrison and Graham Berry etc., who excel in what they do to bring out the best in any soloist, whether string or vocal. I enjoy listening to jazz guitar, and in fact any talented soloist can turn me on.

### Do you have a favourite tune?

There are many, and I would hesitate to name just one! When playing for SCD, I tend to use tunes that I see and hear dancers respond to on the dance floor. I like to see dancers 'move to the music' whether they are actually dancing or waiting their turn on the set. In other words, I tend to play tunes favoured by dancers rather than myself, and quite simply said, if they enjoy both the dancing and the music, I drive home to Aberdeen a happy man!

• Your playing has taken you all over the world, what countries have you visited? My music has taken me to many foreign lands, and I probably have to thank St Andrews Summer School for opening up the world. The countries which come to mind are scattered throughout the Middle and Far East, throughout Europe such as France, Spain, Germany, Holland, Norway and Italy.

#### Are there any events or countries that you have particularly enjoyed?

My favourite events are probably in San Francisco, Portland Oregon, and Vancouver. However, albeit it's exciting to travel, I enjoy every bit as much playing here at home in Scotland for rallies and SCD events whether it be in the North of Scotland, or Tayside, or annually for the Millport weekend on the Isle of Cumbrae!

### Do you have time for any other interests other than playing?

I started off a banking career with the Clydesdale Bank in Scott Street, Perth in 1960 when music became very much secondary in my life, and for some 35 years I did not play for SCD. However, following early retirement in Aberdeen in1995 I have been sucked into a music career which leaves me little time for any other leisure activities. 'If music be the food of life - play on'! The RSCDS is a rich and wonderful society movement with which to be associated, and I would heartily recommend it to anybody, whether dancer or musician.
