As a surprise I decided to write a dance for the evening and Netta and the class seemed to like it. When the RSCDS put out a call for dances for Book 48 I submitted it, with Netta's permission, and was very pleased when it was accepted for publication.

Graham Berry then wrote the music and named it 'Ballinbreich' after the farm where his late father Jim was brought up.

DANCING IN PERTHSHIRE

I devised Dancing in Perthshire as a way of acknowledging the welcome my husband John and I received from dancers in the Branch when we moved to Auchterarder in 2017. They are always friendly and willing to ask you to dance, even if they don't know you. You have hardly sat down after a dance before someone is inviting you to partner them for the next dance!!

When we were hunting for a property to buy in the area, we visited lots of different places, but many of them were miles up a B road and I wasn't too sure about going places on my own in the dark up and down narrow country roads. Then we happened upon Auchterarder, a lovely wee town but only a mile or so from the A9 and so our move to Perthshire was sealed.

I like 4 couple strathspeys and therefore devised this as a 4×32 bar dance. Hopefully not too difficult to get the hang of it but pleasant to dance.

The first sixteen bars of the dance reflect all those narrow winding country roads that lots of people have to travel along in order to meet up at a dance. Bars 17 - 24 represent meeting different people, the warm welcome we received on moving to the area and everyone's willingness to invite you to dance. The last 8 bars are all about everyone enjoying the dance.

Originally the dance did not have its own tune. However, at the classes which were held in Scone to go through the dances in the book, I was in the same set as Mo Rutherford when we were doing 'Dancing in Perthshire'. At the end of the dance she turned to me and asked if I had a tune for it, to which I said "No". She then told me she had enjoyed doing the dance and asked if she could write a tune for it. I was overwhelmed by her gesture and delighted to accept her offer. A few years ago my husband John and I were walking along a street in the centre of Perth and met Mo coming out of a greengrocer's shop clutching one carrot. John teased her about only buying one carrot (Mo's reasoning was she only needed one carrot to cook dinner that evening so why buy more!) and nicknamed her "One Carrot Mo", a name which he still calls her!! Hence my gift of a Kevin the Carrot soft toy (in his kilt) who now sits on Mo's piano and it is lovely to see him enjoying Mo's playing and our dancing.

PERTH REELS FOR REAL

During the pandemic the Perth and Perthshire Branch asked members to devise a dance which would be used as part of their 95th Anniversary celebration. I decided to accept the challenge and devised the dance "Perth Reels for Real " The ideal when devising any dance would be to have 6 or 8 willing dancers who would walk the dance and let you change things once you saw how it worked out in practice. However, during a pandemic is not the best time to expect people to get together to help you out!

I chose the name because we were really missing our dancing at that time and thought we would rather be "reeling" together instead of "reeling " from the restrictions enforced by the pandemic . Hence "Reeling for Real "

The formations in the dance included reels in promenade hold - getting back together. Set and link - linking up again with dancing friends. Circle - bring everyone back together.

I did not choose any specific music to accompany the instructions. We are so fortunate in Perthshire to have so many excellent bands who would choose an appropriate set of $4 \ge 32$ reels.

You always hope people will enjoy dances you choose for a class or social dance but you feel very anxious if it involves a dance which you have devised. My option is not to mention I devised it!

I totally admire people who devise dances regularly and they must feel proud to see them on dance programmes not only in Scotland but possibly all over the world.
